PLEASE USE	INSTEAD OF
Recover organs	Harvest or procure organs
Recovery or donation of organs This appropriately conveys that organ recovery is a respectful surgical procedure and honors the person giving the gift.	Harvesting or procuring organs
Deceased donor or donation Organs are generously gifted from one person to another; the term cadaver is impersonal and disrespectful to the person giving the gift.	Cadaver or cadaveric donor
Mechanical or ventilated support Organs are kept functioning after death for donation to occur; using the term life support incorrectly implies that the donor is still living.	Life support
Determine brain death Death is determined by medical professionals independent of donation.	Declare brain death
Organs and tissues Organs and tissues are both anatomically correct and respects the humanity of the gift.	Body parts
