

Words Matter: Tips for Sensitive Language

The terms and phrases we use when talking about donation matter. Using the correct words helps communicate respect for the donor, donor families and the decision to give the ultimate gift through organ, eye and tissue donation.

Please use:	Instead of:
Recover organs	Harvest or procure organs
Recovery or donation of organs	Harvesting or procuring organs
This appropriately conveys that organ recovery is a respectful surgical procedure and honors the person giving the gift.	
Deceased donor or donation	Cadaver or cadaveric donor
Organs are generously gifted from one person to another; the term cadaver is impersonal and disrespectful to the person giving the gift.	
Mechanical or ventilated support	Life support
Organs are kept functioning after death for donation to occur; using the term life support incorrectly implies that the donor is still living.	
Determine brain death	Declare brain death
Death is determined by medical professionals independent of donation.	
Organs and tissues	Body parts
Organs and tissues are both anatomically correct and respects the humanity of the gift.
