The Waiting List

There are many more **Texans waiting for a transplant** than there are organs available.

Of Texans waiting for a lifesaving transplant, 43% are Hispanic and 23% are Black. The rest are White, Asian, American Indian, Pacific Islander, or Multiracial

In 2024, **524 Texans** died while waiting for an organ transplant—about **44 people each month**.

That same year, Texans gave the gift of life and healing:

- 1, 980 organ donors (including 768 from living donors)
- Over 4,600 cornea donors, restoring sight
- Over 3,600 tissue donors, helping with surgery, recovery, and treatment

The Registry

- More than 15.4 million Texans have registered their donation decision with Donate Life Texas—a
 record milestone in 2024.
- But 44% of Texans still haven't signed up to be a donor.

Because of donors, **4,418 Texans received lifesaving transplants in 2024**—the most ever in our state. Since one donor can help up to 75 people, these transplants may have touched more than **331,000 lives**.
